Sandwiched between these speakers are our monthly internal competitions and two of our external competitions, a Tripod comp done virtually against Stowmarket and Framlingham on 25 Jan 21 and our annual glimpse of overseas photographers work against Calgary Photographic Society (CAPS) on 2 Mar 21.
